Peace and grace to you all as we enter this sacred season of Holy Week.

As we journey together through the passion, death, and resurrection of Christ, I would like to extend a heartfelt invitation to experience the *Solvitur Ambulando* exhibition—a unique and contemplative art installation designed especially for Holy Week reflection. Curated by Rhythms of Grace Church who meet weekly in the Cathedral Undercroft, the exhibition will use multiple spaces through the Undercroft.

Solvitur Ambulando, meaning “it is solved by walking”, invites us to engage with the story of Christ’s final days not only with our minds and hearts, but also with our bodies. Through visual art, movement, and meditative space, this exhibition offers an embodied encounter with themes of suffering, hope, and redemption. It is an opportunity to walk slowly, to listen deeply, and to be still in the presence of the mystery we remember during this holiest of weeks.

Whether you visit alone, with your family, or as part of a small group, *Solvitur Ambulando* is a space for prayerful reflection and spiritual renewal. It complements our liturgical journey of Holy Week, encouraging us to take a moment before or after the Cathedral services to walk in step with Christ.

We hope you will find meaning, solace, and perhaps even surprising grace in this experience. May this Holy Week be one of profound encounter and transformation for you all.

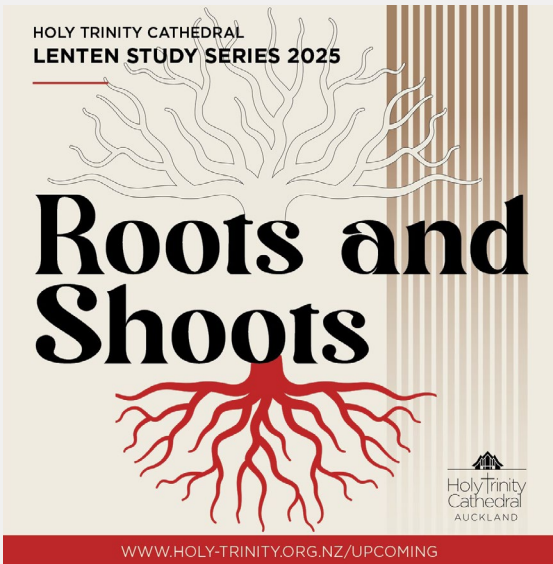

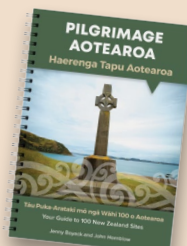

ANGLICANS OPPOSE ‘CHRISTIAN SEDERS’
An article in Anglican Taonga News

Leaders of the Anglican Church in Aotearoa New Zealand and Polynesia have backed a joint Jewish-Anglican statement that recommends Christians refrain from organising or participating in ‘Christian Seders’.

The statement put forward by the Anglican Council for Ecumenism—chaired by our own Dean Anne, with Fr Ivica as a General Synod-appointed representative for interfaith dialogue—and Rabbi Dean Shapiro of Auckland’s Beth Shalom Progressive Jewish Community asks Anglican Christians not to participate in the practice of ‘Christian Seders’ that imitate the Jewish tradition of Seder meals overlaid with Christian themes.

Get ready for a spectacular Mothers’ Day celebration as we bring together two of New Zealand’s finest culinary talents to usher in the return of the dinner party!

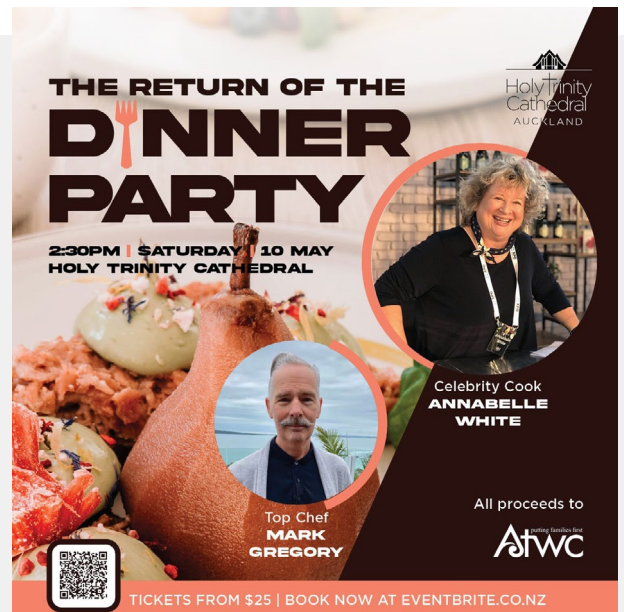

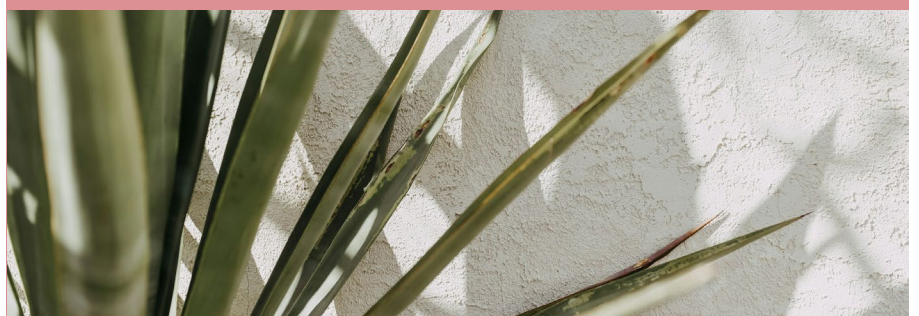

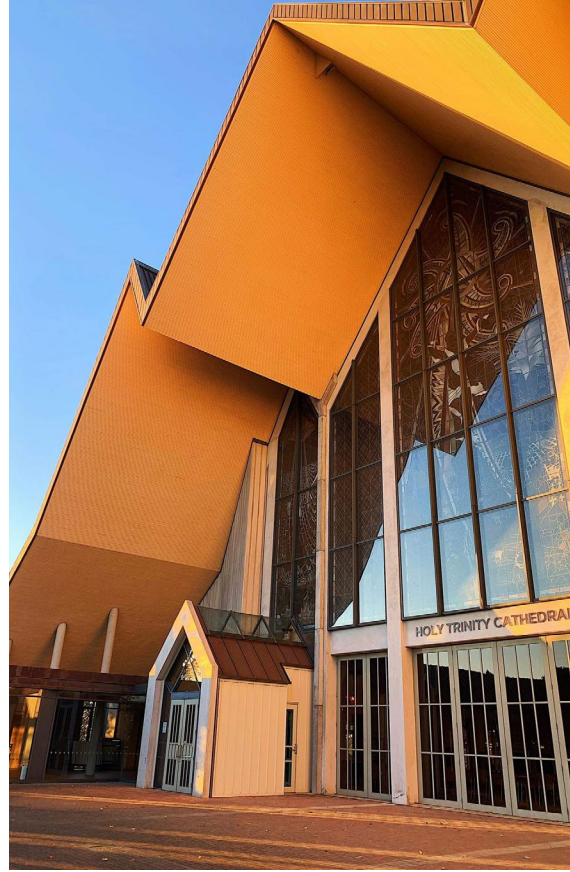
