### The Gathering of the Community

Dear friends, forty days ago we celebrated the birth of our Lord Jesus Christ. Today we celebrate the faithfulness of Mary and Joseph as they bring their baby to the Temple and present him before God. We recall Simeon's deep recognition as he holds Jesus in his arms. Simeon understands that this baby will grow to become a light to our world. Today we seek to encounter you with that same deep knowing. We gather here this morning, breaking bread and sharing wine together, as we celebrate, with Simeon and Anna, Christ's coming amongst us and sing of God's presence and glory with us.

### The Confession


We come seeking forgiveness for all we have failed to be and do as members of Christ's body.

Silence

In God there is forgiveness.

Loving and all-seeing God, forgive us where we have failed to support one another and to be what we claim to be. Forgive us where we have failed to serve you; and where our thoughts and actions have been contrary to yours we ask your pardon.

### The Absolution

God forgives us; be at peace.

Silence

Rejoice and be glad, for Christ is resurrection, reconciliation for all the human race.

We shall all be one in Christ, one in our life together. Praise to God who has created us,

praise to God who has accepted us,

praise to God who sends us into the world.

Gloria - repeat after cantor at beginning and as indicated.



Glory to God in the highest, and peace to God's people on earth. Lord God, heavenly King, almighty God and Father, we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory. *R.*  Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us;

you are seated at the right hand of the Father: receive our prayer. R.

For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. *R.* Gloria

### Responsorial Psalm Psalm 84

The congregation repeats the response R. after the Cantor, and between each verse.



My soul has a desire and longing to enter the courts of the Lord: my heart and my flesh rejoice in the living God. *R.* 

The sparrow finds for herself a house: and the swallow a nest where she may lay her young. They have their home at your altars: my king and my God. *R.* 

O Lord God of hosts:

blessèd are those who dwell in your house. Blessèd are those whose strength is in you: who have set their hearts on pilgrimage. R. For the Lord God is a defence and shield, the Lord will give grace and honour: and no good thing will be withheld from those who live a blameless life. R.



### The Sermon Fr Ivica Gregurec

Following the Sermon, we pause to discern what the Spirit is saying to the Church.

### The Affirmation of Faith

Let us stand and together affirm our faith.

You, O God, are supreme and holy.

You create our world and give us life.

Your purpose overarches everything we do.

You have always been with us.

You are God.

You, O God, are infinitely generous,

good beyond all measure.

You came to us before we came to you.

You have revealed and proved

your love for us in Jesus Christ,

who lived and died and rose again.

You are with us now.

You are God.

You, O God, are Holy Spirit.

You empower us to be your gospel in the world.

You reconcile and heal; you overcome death.

You are our God. We worship you.

### The Prayers of the People

Let us pray for the Church and for the World, giving thanks for God's goodness.

Please sit.

To the bidding: Lord, have mercy. all respond: Christ, have mercy.

The Prayers conclude with the following Collect prayed by all.

God of all peoples, you kept faith with Simeon and Anna, and showed them the infant King. Give us grace to put all our trust in your promises, and the patience to wait for their fulfilment, through Jesus Christ our Redeemer.

Amen.

### The Peace

Blessed be Christ the Prince of Peace who breaks down the walls that divide. The peace of God be always with you. Praise to Christ who unites us in peace.

Please turn and acknowledge those around you by offering a greeting of Peace. During the Offertory Hymn, the bread and wine are prepared for the Eucharist. A Collection is taken at this stage.

### The Preparation of the Gifts


Blessed are you, God of all creation; through your goodness we have these gifts to share. Accept and use our offerings for your glory and for the service of your kingdom.

to warn and to revive your Church.


Therefore, with all your witnesses

we take courage from his ascension;


we look for his coming in glory

### The Communion

As Christ teaches us we pray:

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven.
Give us today our daily bread.
Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us.
Save us from the time of trial and deliver us from evil.
For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours now and for ever. Amen.


The bread is broken in silence.

Christ's body was broken for us on the cross. Christ is the bread of life. Christ's blood was shed for our forgiveness. Christ is risen from the dead.

### The Invitation

Come God's people, come to receive Christ's heavenly food.

Agnus Dei is sung by the cantor and congregation.



All who are baptised are welcome to receive Holy Communion. If you feel uncertain sharing a common cup, receiving the bread alone is to receive a full Communion. For health reasons, we request you do not dip the bread in the wine (intinction).

Please indicate to the administrant if you would prefer a gluten-free wafer.

If you wish to receive a blessing only, please fold your arms across your chest.

As you wait to receive and after returning to your seat, please observe silence and pray for those around you. The Presider will distribute communion at the seats of any who have reduced mobility.

The cantor will sing during the Communion.

### The Prayer after Communion

Please stand.

Loving God, you fulfilled the hope of Simeon and Anna, who lived to welcome the Messiah: may we, who have received these gifts beyond words, prepare to meet Christ Jesus when he comes to bring us eternal life. We thank you, God, that you have fed us in this sacrament, united us with Christ, and given us a foretaste of the heavenly banquet prepared for all peoples. Amen.

### CANDLEMAS PROCESSION TO THE BAPTISMAL FONT

All sing while the Altar party distribute light to the congregation, before processing to the Baptismal Font.

When candles are lighted on Candlemas Day the dark is behind us and Christ's on the way.

Refrain. A glory dawns in every dark place, the light of Christ, the fullness of grace.

The kings have departed, the shepherds have gone, the child and his parents are left on their own. R.

3

They go to the temple, obeying the law, and offer two pigeons, the gift of the poor. *R.* 

4

But Anna and Simeon recognise there the Christ-child who came at the turn of the year. *R.*

### **Blessing of the Candles**

Loving God, the springing source of everlasting light, pour into the hearts of your faithful people the brilliance of your eternal splendour, and \*bless these candles, that we, who by their kindling flames light up this temple to your glory, may have the darkness of our souls dispelled, and so be counted worthy to stand before you in that eternal city where you live and reign, one God, now and for ever.

Like Anna, like Simeon, may we all have trust, the eyes to see Jesus, and peace at the last. *R.* 

10

The candles invite us to praise and to pray when Christmas greets Easter on Candlemas day. *R.*
